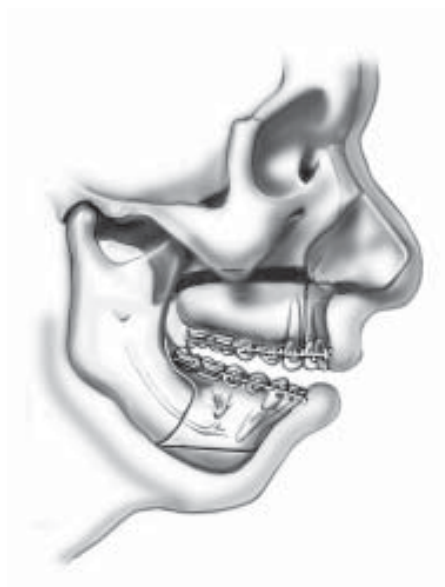

OVERVIEW

This educational activity will focus on interdisciplinary problem solving in orthognathic surgery. Advanced technologies used to solve problems will be highlighted, as well as indications, complications and peri-operative considerations. He is currently Chair of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery department, Head of Hospital Dentistry, and Associate Dean for Hospital Affairs and Residency Education.

Timothy A. Turvey, DDS

After receiving his dental degree from Columbia University, Dr. Turvey trained in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Parkland Memorial Hospital. Since 1994, he has served as Professor and Chairman of the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of North Carolina. He has published more than 100 peer reviewed manuscripts, book chapters and co edited two major textbooks including *Orthognathic Surgery* and another entitled *Facial Clefts and Craniosynostosis*. He has received numerous honors and awards including the William H. Geis Award for Excellence in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Dr. Turvey is considered a world renowned Orthognathic Surgeon.

Robert L. Vanarsdall, Jr., DDS

Dr. Robert L. Vanarsdall, Jr. is Professor of Orthodontics and Chairman of the Department of Orthodontics at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine. He is a member of the American Association of Orthodontists and the Middle Atlantic Society of Orthodontists. He received his dental degree from the Medical College of Virginia and is board certified in both Orthodontics and Periodontics. Dr. Vanarsdall served as Chairman of the Department of Periodontics, Department of Pediatric Dentistry and has directed Orthodontics at Penn since 1981. He is on the staff at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and Professor at the Medical College of Pennsylvania. In addition to his teaching commitment, he maintains an active private practice.



David A. Walker, DDS, MS, FRCD(C)

Dr. Walker received his Doctor of Dental Surgery from University of Toronto and completed his residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and a Master of Science at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Dr. Walker has published numerous articles and book chapter in Distraction Osteogenesis and has given numerous lectures internationally.
