Course Overview:

The program focuses on describing the state of the art in adult and pediatric craniomaxillofacial surgery. Live surgery with panel discussions will provide participants with an opportunity for direct visualization and interaction in problem cases. Didactic lectures and panel discussions will supplement the educational experience with a comprehensive review of relevant topics.

Objectives:

- Become familiar with treatment options for congenital cranial vault deformities.
- Learn principles of orthognathic surgery and distraction osteosynthesis.
- Be able to assess and manage facial fractures.
- Become familiar with current techniques employed in the secondary reconstruction of the orbit, midface and mandible.

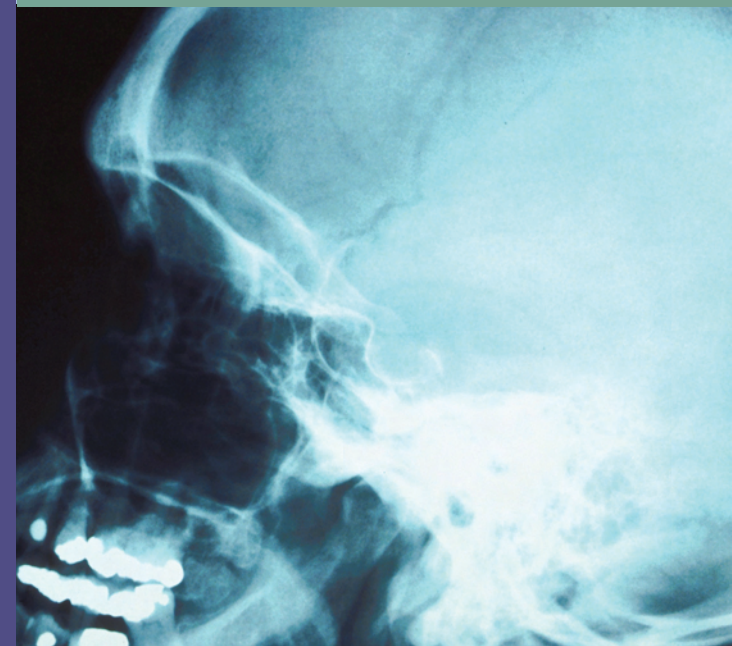
