Directions

North on I-85 from Hartsfield Airport

Take I-85 North through downtown Atlanta. I-75 and I-85 will merge and then split. Please stay on I-85. Continue to the off-ramp for GA 400, exit #87 (Buckhead). Take 400 North to Exit #2, Lenox/Buckhead. At the bottom of the ramp, turn right and follow the signs for Peachtree Road. You will see the Parisian department store ahead on the left. The Ritz-Carlton, Buckhead is on the right.

South on I-85

Take the Lenox Road exit (exit #88) and at the bottom of the exit ramp, turn right onto Lenox Road. Go 1.9 miles, then follow the signs to Monarch Drive/Ritz Drive. Turn left into the hotel.

South on I-75

Case Submission Form

Attendees are encouraged to submit a patient case for presentation to the faculty panel during the meeting.

Criteria for Cases

Your case:

- Should include:
 - patient history
 - diagnosis
 - pre-, intra-, and post-op x-rays
- May demonstrate:
 - positive or less-than optimal outcome
 - complications or unusual outcome
 - case with several treatment options / case has not had definitive treatment yet or need help in making a decision
- Needs to be de-identified regarding the patient, to be in compliance with HIPAA
- Cases submitted will be reviewed by the co-chairs for quality of content, demonstrable teaching points, and potential for variable approaches and management choices. If your case is accepted, you should plan on presenting for 3-4 minutes, followed by a 6-7 minute faculty panel discussion
