Patient history

- 69 year old male
- Active; plays golf and pickleball; cycles daily
- Right knee pain for 2+ years
- Medial bone on bone osteoarthritis
- \bullet Isolated unicompartmental disease

Michael Morwood, M.D.

Patient history

- 67 year old female
- Active
- Right knee pain
- Significant medial joint space narrowing
- Retained lateral joint space and appropriate patella tracking

Patient history

- 83 year old female with a BMI of 26
- Long standing pain along medial aspect of knee for 2 years
- Has tried PT and injections with no improvement
- Range of motion 0-120 degrees
- Negative Lachman test

Patient history

- Active 68 year old male
- Medial left knee pain for 1 year
- Attempted meniscus debridement 10 months prior with no improvement
- Correctable varus
- Negative patellar grind 0-135 degrees of motion
